- Treasurer's Report
  - Balance Last Report: \$5,761.64
  - Credits: \$4,403.53Debts: \$367.20
  - o Balance This Report: \$9,797.97 (what are the odds?!)
- Gary: Discussion of use of funds from raffle and other improvements
  - o Potential for a storage container to be located at the launch site.
    - Currently belongs to a client of Dave Armstrong's.
    - Setup for storage
    - Container is FREE, just have to pay to move it.
    - We will have to have more discussion about how to reduce risk of vandalism and theft
    - Part of the motivation is uncertainty in our current parking spot for the trailer in Brothers.
  - Another option is buying a second trailer. If we had two, one would be Brothers-Only gear, the other would serve Brothers and Sheridan.
  - Potential to get new pads from a welder in Bend that will be making new ones for Tri-Cities Rocketeers. Quote is ~\$600 each. We would probably order three.
    - George Rachor has purchased a used Quad-Pod that he can make available for Sheridan and NXRS

- First Aid Equipment. We need to do more research and get equipment. Gary Goncher has a new contact we could use for supplies. We may also look into paying for First Responder / CPR / AED training.
- Robert is still pursuing purchasing 4 porta potties. 2 would be new to the flightline, 2 would replace the oldest of the current arsenal.
- New Low Power Controller for Garden Home
  - Sunriver Bob apparently has a unit we could acquire for cheap / free. We will look into it.
- Working on the old wired system to convert it to a Brothers Low Power Controller
- AP Showers Planning April 24-26
  - We need a trailer hauler Volunteer!
    - Little over 3000 lbs, the club will pay for gas.
  - We also need volunteers to help set up
- Rack cards!
  - o Tim Ryerse has the schedule rack cards and available for distribution.
- Application has been submitted for Garden Home launches. No foreseeable issues at this point.
- New Business
  - o Erik McKee:
    - New RA rule with regard to electronic switches under TRA rules
      - Electronic switches such as EggTimer Proton, Eggtimer Quantum, or Kate 2.0, MUST HAVE A MANUAL DISCONNECT. You cannot rely solely on the software disarm.
        - Mag switches don't count, they have never been approved by
      - That switch must be open (disconnected) until you are at the pad (or at least away from the flight line).
  - Waiver might be switching to a 2-year interval.
  - NARCON is in Tuscon, AZ the first week of March, a few OROC members are going.
  - George Rachor: NAR has a new rule specifically stating that drones are NOT covered by NAR insurance. We will add a note to the website.
    - There are other operational rules we will be reviewing on the website as well.
      We will keep the club posted on any changes.
